## ELYSIAN CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING JUNE 12, 2023

The Elysian City Council met in regular session on Monday, June 12, 2023 at City Hall at 6:00 pm.

The meeting was opened, and a moment of silence was held for Elysian Firefighter Wayne James.

Roll Call: Mayor Tom McBroom, Sr.; Councilmembers Bobby Houlihan, Dennis Schnoor and Derek Westby; City Administrator Lorri Kopischke; Public Works Director Ron Greenwald. Absent: Councilmember Bryan Suemnick and City Attorney Jason Moran.

On motion by Schnoor, seconded by Houlihan, all voting in favor, to approve the minutes of the May 8, 2023 Regular Meeting and the June 1, 2023 Special Meeting as presented.

On motion by Westby, seconded by Schnoor, all voting in favor, to approve the agenda of the June 12, 2023 Regular Meeting as presented.

Le Sueur County Captain Bruce Collins reported the normal events in the City to include medical, traffic, scams. This month will start the planning for the July 4<sup>th</sup> activities.

The Council asked that a deputy patrol the ballfields to enforce the no parking restrictions.

Public Comment: None.

On motion by McBroom, seconded by Houlihan, all voting in favor, to close the Regular Meeting and open the Public Hearing at 6:06 pm.

The purpose of the public hearing is to allow public input from citizens on proposed Ordinance No. 105/23 – An Ordinance Amending §156.068 of the Elysian Zoning Code pertaining to C-2 Highway Commercial District.

The Planning and Zoning Committee has recommended an update to the language in this section of the ordinance as it is antiquated and restrictive. The City Attorney has updated the ordinance to allow additional uses as conditional uses. Conditional uses are subject to Council approval and Council can require specific performance standards such as screening, parking, etc.

There were no public comments. There were no written comments.

On motion by McBroom, seconded by Schnoor, all voting in favor, to close the Public Hearing and open the Regular Meeting at 6:08 pm.

Don Williamson, Owner, and Mike Rhodes, Operations Supervisor, West Central Sanitation, were present to discuss service concerns and the recent Spring Clean Up Event.

Williamson noted work force shortages and new drivers not used to the system. He expressed his commitment and promise to respond to complaints and issues as they arise and hopes to continue to provide excellent service to the City of Elysian.

Rhodes stated he has modified equipment and had meetings with all his drivers to resolve complaints. He reminds his drivers weekly.

On motion by McBroom, seconded by Westby, all voting in favor, to proceed with negotiation of a three year contract for garbage and recycling service with West Central effective October 1, 2023.

Ordinance No. 105/23 was presented by Councilmember Westby and seconded by Councilmember Schnoor as follows:

## CITY OF ELYSIAN LE SUEUR COUNTY, MINNESOTA ORDINANCE NO. 105/23

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING §156.068 OF THE ELYSIAN ZONING CODE PERTAINING TO C-2 HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL DISTRICT

The City Council for the City of Elysian, Le Sueur County, Minnesota, does hereby Ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Elysian is empowered by State Law to enact various Zoning Controls for the development of land in the City's Corporate Limits.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

That Elysian Zoning Code §156.068 C-2, Highway Commercial District shall read as follows:

- (A) *Purpose.* The Highway Commercial District (C-2) is meant to allow for the continuation and addition of new businesses into the community that are not appropriate in the downtown area, due to space requirements and/or design elements that are inconsistent with the historic or traditional downtown atmosphere.
- (B) Permitted uses.
  - (1) Personal services such as laundry, barber, shoe repair shops and photography studios;
  - Repair and maintenance services, such as jewelry and radio and television repair shops;
  - (3) Offices, professional services, such as medical and dental clinics, architects and attorneys' offices, finance, insurance, and real estate services;
  - (4) Eating and drinking establishments; and
  - (5) Community/governmental buildings.
- (C) Accessory uses. Uses incidental to the permitted uses that are located on the same lot.
- (D) Conditional uses.
  - (1) Fast food and drive-in establishments;
  - (2) Hotels and motels;
  - (3) Car, farm equipment and implement sales;
  - (4) Light assembly production;
  - (5) Gas stations and auto repair shops;
  - (6) Lumber yards and warehousing;
  - (7) Utility structures;
  - (8) Commercial planned unit developments (including campground/resort facilities);
  - (9) Amusement establishments, such as movie theaters, bowling alleys and pool halls;

- (10) Therapeutic massage enterprise;
- (11) Establishments selling intoxicating liquor (both on and off sale);
- (12) Retail stores selling consumer goods.
- (13) Auto sales shops.
- (14) Animal clinics.
- (15) Dry Cleaning stores and/or laundry facilities.
- (16) Finance companies.
- (17) Furniture stores.
- (18) Car washes.
- (19) Churches.
- (20) Schools.
- (E) Standards.
  - (1) Height regulations: no building hereafter erected or altered shall exceed four stories or 45 feet in height;
  - (2) Front yard regulations: there shall be a minimum of 30 feet for a front yard setback;
  - (3) Side yard regulations: no building shall be located within 20 feet of any side lot line abutting any residence district;
  - (4) Rear yard regulations: no building shall be located within 20 feet of any rear lot line;
  - (5) Minimum setbacks from state and/or local bike trails: no building shall be located within 50 feet from the trail centerline;
  - (6) Every principal use is required to display its street number, attached to the front of the building, so that the location can be identified easily from the road. If the building's distance from the road's curb or edge of driving service exceeds 75 feet, the address number shall be displayed at the beginning\_of the driveway closest to the curb or road; and
  - (7) (a) Galvanized corrugated S-Type metal roofing materials are not permitted to be used on any structures.

(b) Metal roof shingles are permitted. Standing seam metal roofing systems and ribbed roofing systems may also be allowed, but they must be the type of panels that have a factory applied lifetime color coating system applied.

(F) *General Regulations.* Additional general regulations for the commercial district are set forth in performance standards (§§ 156.105 through 156.124) of this chapter).

(G) Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective upon publication.

WHEREAS, pursuant to proper notice duly given as required by law, the Council has met and heard and passed upon all objections to the proposed assessment for the 2023 Street and Utility Improvement Project, which includes improvements on the following streets:

- Maple Avenue from 5th Street SW to 1st Street S
- Lewis Lane from 5th Street SW to Dead End
- G Avenue SE from 1st Street S to Jason Drive
- Jason Drive from G Avenue SE to Dead End
- 5th Street SW from Maple Avenue to Hwy 60
- 3rd Street SW from Maple Avenue to Hwy 60
- 1st Street S from Maple Avenue to Hwy 60

by construction of sanitary sewer, sanitary sewer services, water main, water services, storm sewer, concrete curb and gutter, aggregate base, bituminous surfacing, turf restoration, and miscellaneous items required to properly complete the improvements and has amended such proposed assessment as it deems just.

- 1. Such proposed assessment, as amended, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby accepted and shall constitute the special assessment against the lands named therein, and each tract of land therein included is hereby found to be benefited by the improvement in the amount of the assessment levied against it.
- 2. Such assessment shall be payable in equal annual installments, including principal and interest, extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on

or before the first Monday in January 2024, and will bear interest at a rate not to exceed 5.0 percent per annum after October 31, 2023.

- 3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the County Auditor-Treasurer on November 1, 2023, pay the whole or part of the assessment on such property with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City Administrator, except that no interest shall be charged on any portion of the assessment paid by October 31, 2023. The property owner may at any time thereafter, pay to the County Auditor-Treasurer the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.
- 4. No more than two partial payments of a minimum of \$500 shall be allowed prior to October 31, 2023.
- 5. The City Administrator shall forthwith transmit a certified duplicate of this assessment to the County Auditor-Treasurer to be extended on the property tax lists of the county. Such assessment shall be collected and paid over in the same manner as other municipal taxes.

Kavitz presented W W Blacktopping, Inc. Pay Application No. 1 in the amount of \$290,590.42. The majority of work included is storm sewer and watermain on Jason Drive, G Avenue, and Maple Avenue prior to the gravel being placed.

On motion by Westby, seconded by Houlihan, all voting in favor, to approve and accept W W Blacktopping, Inc. Pay Application No. 1 in the amount of \$290,590.42.

Kavitz updated the Council on the 2023 Street and Utility Improvement Project (SUIP). The majority of the concrete curb and driveways are done in Phase 1. The concrete in the Casey's area is complete and now that the concrete is done the roadway will be prepped for bituminous. Work has now begun on Maple Avenue between 5<sup>th</sup> Street and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street.

Councilmember Schnoor noted the excellent communication with residents being done by SEH representative Lee Istvanovich and Nate Coon, W W Blacktopping.

The City of Elysian has been awarded \$3.5 million for capital improvements through the State of Minnesota 2023 Bonding Bill to construct, furnish, and equip a water treatment plant to treat drinking water for radium, manganese, and iron bacteria.

Resolution No, 853/23 – Authorizing the City Clerk to file an Application with the MMB Budget Office for the Purpose of Infrastructure Improvement Project is necessary to submit a 2024 capital budget request for further financial assistance for the water treatment plant project.

On motion by Westby, seconded by Houlihan, all voting in favor, to make the initial request to the MMB for the 2024 Bonding Bill for construction of the water treatment plant in the amount of \$7.2 million.

Public Works Director Greenwald presented the quote for the new 2023 New Holland Powerstar 120 Tractor from Smiths Mill Implement in the amount of \$91,500 and a trade in offer for the City's New Holland LV80 in the amount of \$18,500.

Smiths Mill Implement also provided a quote for the snow bucket in the amount of \$3,500, the blade in the amount of \$7,400, and the snowblower in the amount of \$15,500.

The current interest rate for financing is 4.23% with a term of 5 years. This rate could fluctuate between now and the expected delivery date of October 2023.

On motion by Schnoor, seconded by Westby, all voting in favor, to approve the purchase of the New 2023 New Holland Powerstar 120, the snow bucket, blade and snowblower per submitted quote and trade in the City's NH LV80 for a trade in amount of \$18,500 to be applied to the purchase price. The snow bucket, blade, and snowblower will be paid for in cash from the Maintenance Equipment Replacement Savings Account in the amount of \$26,400. The tractor New Holland Powerstar 120 will be financed in the amount of \$91,500 less the trade in of the NH LV80.

Greenwald discussed a request from Jacob Lee to connect to City sewer services for the property located east of Ahavah Cottage. Two options are being considered. One is to bore across Sunset Park and utilize a gravity system. The other is to connect to the west of the Cottage and utilize an E1 Grinder Pump System.

Council requested specific plans to be considered at the July 10, 2023 meeting.

Greenwald reported he will be replacing the steps behind the City Hall with preformed 6" x 4' steps. Each step is \$126 and Public Works will perform the labor.

WHEREAS, the bill was set to go into effect August 1, 2023 and would not interfere is the 2023 existing holiday calendar but after being duly passed in both the House (HF 1830) and the Senate (SF 1426), the Governor signed the bill into law that the bill will go into effect May 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, this bill will be in effect on June 19, 2023 and as recognition of this holiday, no public business can be conducted on Juneteenth; and

WHEREAS, The City of Elysian will recognize Juneteenth as a holiday beginning June 19, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Elysian Personnel Policy shall be amended with the addition of Juneteenth as an observed holiday.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Elysian City Council established Juneteenth (June 19) as a City of Elysian holiday with the closure of City offices; and the date and rules of observance of the holiday shall be specified in Minnesota Statutes §645.44.

A City of Elysian Compensation Study prepared by the Minnesota Valley Council of Governments was presented to the Council on April 26, 2023. The results of that study are that the average hourly compensation rate of all four full-time positions is 8.84% lower than market comparable. In an attempt

to provide a salary that is closer to the average, the Council has requested the cost to provide the four full-time employees with a 1.5% mid-year (effective the first pay period in July through December 31, 2023) increase to their hourly rate.

That total cost is as follows:

Wages:	\$1,702.40
FICA:	\$ 130.23
PERA:	<u>\$ 127.68</u>
Total Cost:	\$1,960.31

The new door and keypad reader security system have been installed at the Tourism Center Building. There are two locked entrances to the door. Hawk Alarm System Inc. has provided a proposal to install the same keypad reader to those doors and have them all keyed the same. The proposal is in the amount of \$3,081.94. This amount is not budgeted but could possibly be paid from Cable Savings. There will also be a monthly access control fee of \$6.00 per door.

On motion by Schnoor, seconded by Houlihan, all voting in favor, to approve the proposal in the amount of \$3,081.94 from Hawk Alarm Systems, Inc. to install the same keypad reader to the additional two entrance doors at the Tourism Center Building.

The Council discussed the light replacement on Main Street.

On motion by McBroom, seconded by Schnoor, to approve the installation of (4) taller poles with cobra LED lights and aluminum poles at the intersections and (10) ten decorative lights with the aluminum pole style B with the 15-foot base mounted with decorative base color bronze with outlets or outlet capability and the acorn style LED Luminaire with the prepay rate for a contract of 25 years with an approximate project cost of \$125,000.

Thank you to Lake Area Women for donating and planting the flowers around the City and also to Audene and Kris Greenwald for help with planting.

The Council would like to recognize the Greenwald family in some way for all the beautification they have done in the City over the years. This was referred to the Park Board for consideration.

Westby spoke with regard to the wage study. He asked the Council to remember what these employees do for the City.

Houlihan stated he is 100% in support of the employees, but the Council cannot make wage adjustments mid-year.

McBroom stated the intent is 1.5% increase July 1 and a 1.5% increase end of 2023.

Westby stated the employees have the option to make more money elsewhere, but they choose to stay here and make less money because they love the City. This staff is a well-oiled machine, and the Council does not want to lose that.

On motion by McBroom, seconded by Houlihan, all voting in favor, bills, payroll, and transfers were approved in the amount of \$629,434.30.
