PLEASE NOTE: Effective November 1st through November 26th the hours will be changed on Wednesdays to 2:00 to 5:00 pm. Open only to citizens of the City of Elysian. Leaves, brush, and tree wood allowed – no building materials.

Hydrants will be flushed on November 20th. This will depend on weather and will be the last flush of the season.

ELYSIAN CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING SUMMARY OCTOBER 13, 2025 AT 6:00 PM

Clerk/Administrator Kopischke administered the oath of office with Councilmember Steve Hoppe answering.

Present: Mayor Dennis Schnoor; Councilmembers Steve Hoppe (arrived at 6:05 pm), Paul Hunter, and Derek Westby; City Administrator Lorri Kopischke; Public Works Director Ron Greenwald; City Attorney Jason Moran. Absent: Councilmember Bobby Houlihan.

Public Comment: (For complete comments please see approved City Council minutes.) Mark Sybilrud, 514 Lake Avenue NW, thanked all six candidates who participated in the application process for Council and expressed his disappointment in the process. Sybilrud also expressed disappointment that there is not always a full Council and

concern about voting for Fire Department issues when members are missing and so many other members are on the Fire Department. He was also disappointed that Bryan Suemnick knew that he was moving out of the City and still ran for the position and won and it didn't make sense. Sybilrud stated that at the last couple of meetings the Council looks for City Attorney assistance, and he has not been here. The Council should be acting as #1 transparency and #2 best interest of the community.

Scheduled a workshop meeting for Monday, October 27, 2025 at 6:00 pm.

Received Planning and Zoning recommendations for actions within the Comprehensive Land Use Plan for year 2026.

Received report that City Administrator performance review was completed and she did very well.

Received correspondence from DNR re: conveyance of Sakatah Trail properties through the City. Council consensus is to wait to accept the property until after realignment of the trail on the western block.

Approved Resolution #971/25 – Approving Consent Special Assessment PID# 16.435.0020 and PID# 16.435.0060.
